

We, ISOROC POLSKA S.A. the manufacturer of mineral wool boards, used in the construction industry for heat, thermal, acoustic, and fire insulations, inform those concerned that the ingredients used for manufacturing our mineral wool products are not classified as hazardous under the EC Regulation 1907/2006 (REACH) concerning chemicals.

Mineral wool is composed of the following ingredients:

1. GABBRO is a natural product, exempt from the registration obligation under Annex V Section 7 of REACH
2. DOLOMITE is a natural product, exempt from the registration obligation under Annex V Section 7 of REACH
3. COKE is not a hazardous substance, classification is not required according to the applicable provisions of Regulation (EC) NR 1272/2008 and Directive 67/548/EEC
4. EMOIL is not a hazardous substance or mixture according to Regulation EC - Directive 67/548/EEC or 1999/45/EC
5. PHENOL-FORMALDEHYDE RESIN – satisfies the definition of a polymer, is exempt from the registration and assessment obligations under Art. 2 Section 9 and Art. 3 Section 5 of REACH.

Mineral wool boards made by ISOROC POLSKA comply with the requirements of the Regulation of the Minister of Health and Social Welfare of 12.03.1996 concerning the permissible exposure limit values of harmful factors generated by construction materials, appliances and fitments in areas intended for human stay (Monitor Polski, No. 231:1996), according to the Test Report No. LFS00-1260/13/Z00NF of the Building Research Institute (ITB), Warsaw.
